Greetings!

The KBPW Foundation Board of Trustees, would like to thank everyone who donated to the Promise Campaign at Interim Board during the bingo fundraiser in Berea, KY. Because of your generosity, a total of \$3,419 was donated to be used for scholarships. ### STANDING COMMITTEES

**Aspiring Professional:** Coordinate and promote the Aspiring Professional Program on the state level; assist in developing AP programs on local and regional levels; assist regional aspiring professional candidates in preparing for program at State Conference.

**Bylaws:** Review and approve amendments to local organization bylaws; review the amendments bylaws approved at the annual state conference to determine if any mandatory changes to the local organization bylaws are required; prepare and/or present any proposed state bylaws amendments to the state conference body; inform local organizations of any and all required changes to local bylaws.

**Finance:** Develop and monitor the annual budget for KFBPW.

**Issues Management/Legislation:** Responsible for developing KFBPW's legislative platform; Understand and educate members about KFBPW's state legislative platforms; Educate and inform local organizations about the KFBPW issues; Organize program(s) or project(s) around those issues; Identify and inform locals of pending and prospective state and national legislation of particular interest to women and how it relates to our legislative platform and public policy issues; Educate and involve members in the legislative process.

**Membership:** Responsible for membership retention, recruitment and mentoring; Develop a membership campaign for membership recruitment and retention; Develop and establish a program to provide the opportunity to connect women as both mentors and protégés to share career knowledge and professional experience(s). This position is as much as you can make it!

**Professional Development Program:** Assist locals in developing and coordinating an Professional Development program and/or competition focusing on increasing women's communication and leadership skills.

**Public Relations:** Communicate our message and activities to the public by interacting with the media and other organizations and by funneling information and local organization news to media outlets.

### SPECIAL COMMITTEES, TASK FORCES & APPOINTMENTS

**Database Manager:** Update and maintain KFBPW membership database; Create monthly membership report; Generate mailing list for *The Kentucky Cardinal*; Generate mailing labels, membership reports, etc. as requested by local organizations and state leadership.

**Expansion Task Force:** Expand and revitalize the number of local organizations in Kentucky; assist struggling locals with revitalization strategies upon request.

**Kentucky Foundation Board:** Willing to serve on the Board of Trustees for a three year term. The Foundation Board is responsible for selecting and awarding scholarships and grants; Solicit funds for scholarships from KFBPW members and locals as well as businesses; hold fundraising events at Interim Board and State Conference.

**Interim Board Contact:** Coordinate and plan all activities surrounding Interim Board of Directors meeting.

**Internal Auditor:** Provides the independent check of the financial records of the state organization

**Kentucky Cardinal Editor:** Prepare, with input from KFBPW President, all issues of the Kentucky Cardinal for publication; Coordinate advertising sales for *The Kentucky Cardinal*; Urge locals to solicit for advertising and/or obtain advertising contacts; Follow up on all contacts.

**Kentucky Professional Women's Week Chair:** Organize nominations from local organizations for Woman of Achievement, Women of the Year, and Businesses Promoting Women Award candidates for presentation at State Conference meeting; obtain judges to make selection for state winner.

**Legal Advisor:** Advise president and Board of Directors on any necessary legal matters.

**State Convention Contact:** Coordinate and plan all activities surrounding the KFBPW State Conference.

**Webmaster:** Maintain website for KFBPW information, activities and other uses as defined by the Executive Committee. Knowledge of Wordpress needed.

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

## Why are Kentucky licenses changing?

Kentucky is advancing the process of issuing driver's license, permit and personal ID cards in an effort to improve the security of state-issued credentials and comply with federal standards. The 2005 REAL ID Act changes state requirements and procedures for the issuance of identity credentials accepted by select federal agencies, including the Transportation Security Administration. Starting Oct. 1, 2020, Kentucky's current and new standard credentials will no longer be accepted for U.S. air travel or entering restricted federal facilities, like military bases, nuclear power plants or the White House. A phased, statewide rollout of the new credentials and changes will begin in January 2019 and be complete by spring.

## Will current credentials become invalid when the new credentials roll out in early 2019?

Current licenses, permits and IDs will remain valid until their expiration date. Once new credentials are available in your county of residence, you do not need to replace your current card with a new version unless:

- Your card is within its renewal window (6 months prior to the card's expiration date)
- Your name, address or gender changes
- You would like a Voluntary Travel ID and your card's renewal window does not allow you to renew prior to Oct. 1, 2020 when federal enforcement begins

## What happens if I want a Voluntary Travel ID but my renewal window doesn't allow me to renew before the Oct. 1, 2020 federal enforcement date?

Applicants who desire a Voluntary Travel ID and have a credential with a renewal window that does not allow them to renew prior to Oct. 1, 2020 may apply by presenting their current license, permit or ID at the Circuit Court Clerk office in their county of residence, bringing in the required documentation and sitting for a new photo. The applicant will pay \$15 to upgrade to a Voluntary Travel ID credential that maintains their current credential's expiration date. If an applicant's current license, permit or ID has a renewal window that allows them to renew prior to Oct. 1, 2020, they should apply during that window.

**Remember to check your current card's expiration date!**

# PRICING

New pricing will be in place to account for the doubled renewal cycle and additional security features of all identity credentials. For the first four years of the new issuance process, non-CDL applicants and those 21 and older may choose between a four-year or eight-year credential (all CDL credentials will be valid for eight years). **Beginning January 1, 2023, all credentials issued will be valid for eight years.**



## WHAT'S STAYING THE SAME

- As long as Kentucky maintains an extension from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security through October 1, 2020, residents may continue to use current licenses for U.S. air travel and restricted federal facility entry.
- Residents will continue to apply at the Circuit Court Clerk office in their county of residence.
- Applicants may only renew their current credential within 6 months of its expiration date.

# WHICH CREDENTIAL IS RIGHT FOR YOU?

Citizens may request a license, permit or personal ID in one of two new versions: a new standard credential or a Voluntary Travel ID credential. The list below compares the benefits of each card type.

## Kentucky VOLUNTARY TRAVEL ID

## Kentucky STANDARD CREDENTIAL



Driving (licenses, permits)



Voting



Age-restricted purchases



Accessing federal and social benefits (Social Security offices, VA hospitals, etc.)



Flying in the U.S. (Beginning Oct. 1, 2020)



Visiting military bases and restricted federal facilities (Beginning Oct. 1, 2020)



Current and new standard credentials are acceptable for U.S. air travel and military base entry until federal enforcement starts Oct. 1, 2020, as long as Kentucky is under extension. **A passport is still required for international flights and is a valid form of identification for U.S. air travel.**

# DOCUMENTS YOU NEED TO APPLY

First-time applicants requesting **any** credential, or a U.S. citizen or permanent resident requesting a Voluntary Travel ID credential, will need to present documentation (please visit [drive.ky.gov](http://drive.ky.gov) for a full list). A 30-day temporary credential will be issued until the card arrives in the mail.

## IMPORTANT NOTES

- Unless a name or address change is needed, those renewing a standard credential will only need to present their current license, permit or ID at the Circuit Court Clerk office in their county of residence.
- If your current legal name, date of birth, or gender is different than what is displayed on your identity or lawful status document, you must show legal proof of the changes (i.e. marriage license).
- Non-U.S. citizens will present legal presence documentation and pay a \$30 application fee at any Division of Driver Licensing Regional Field Office prior to requesting a standard credential.
