## Eclipse Viewing Tips

Viewing Kentucky's total solar eclipse can be a truly amazing experience, but keep in mind there are certain risks associated with eclipse viewing. Special attention should always be paid to safety to ensure a happy viewing experience. To avoid potential accidents or health problems, here are some things you need to remember before turning your gaze to the sky **August 21, 2017**.

According to NASA, "Even when 99 percent of the sun's surface is obscured during the partial phases of a total eclipse, the remaining photospheric crescent is intensely bright and cannot be viewed safely without eye protection."

Five tips to remember before viewing a Solar Eclipse "Protect Your Eyes"

- \*Don't look directly at the sun to avoid eye damage
- \*Sunglasses won't provide sufficient protection
- \*Use Solar Eclipse Viewing glasses that meet ISO 12312-2
- \*Use an approved solar filter like #14 welder's glass
- \*Create a pinhole projector with a card board box



When to wear Solar glasses - Point of first contact is at 11:51 a.m. need glasses; totality remove at 1:24 p.m.; eclipse will complete by 2:56 p.m. need glasses to view safely.

Hopkinsville, KY, is considered the epicenter of the first total solar eclipse to sweep across the United States in 99 years on Aug. 21, 2017.
