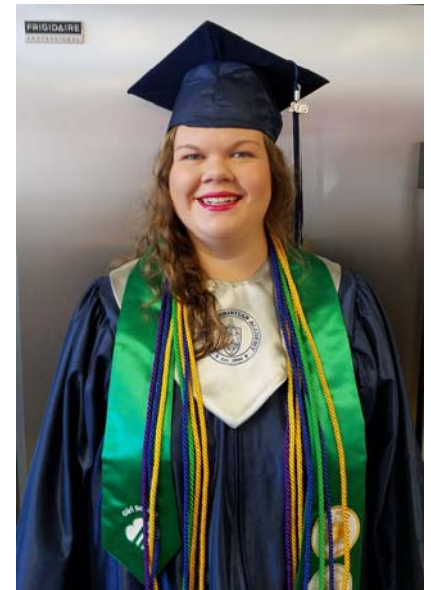

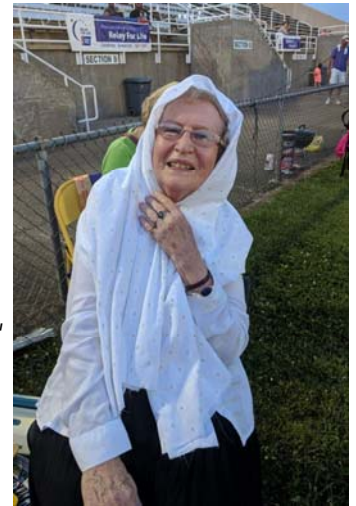


Lena Wann

Mrs. Lena Wann joined the Hopkinsville Club in October 1983.

Ms. Wann has worn many hats in BPW from serving as President in 2007-2008, 2014-2016, Woman of the Year 2001, served in all offices and committee chairs.

She has participated in all BPW activities across the years, from selling pecans, to participating in the American Heart Walk and Relay for Life.



Ms. Wann was born in Greensburg, KY in Green County on Green River. She had one brother, Clay who died in 2005 with cancer.

Ms. Wann graduated from Greensburg High in 1956 & that summer, went to Nashville for business courses, and served as a live-in nanny for 5 little guys while she was in school.

She went to work for MetLife in 1957 for almost 32 years. Ms. Wann met & married Gene during the Nashville years. She was Asst. Office Mgr. in Nashville when they moved to Tampa in 1973. She went to the MetLife Head Office there; Gene to Westinghouse. Lena was a Life Underwriter at MetLife when Gene died in 1980, at the age of 52.

MetLife moved her here to Hopkinsville in November, 1981 as Office Manager for the Branch office and she took early retirement in 1988 when they decided to close the office & merge with Bowling Green.

Lena took some time off, but she was "office girl" for Wally Bryan when he made his first run for mayor. She did some part time with one of the State Farm offices & with Westate Construction for their rental apts.

About 1997 she decided she needed some computer experience; took some classes at HCC which resulted in her working there as part-time Adm. Asst. in the president's office for about 19 years. Lena retired in Dec., 2015. She worked with all the presidents except Dr. Riley who was there when it opened.

Lena joined St. John UMC in 1983, same year that she joined BPW. She has served on several committees at her church during the years; and now she is on Membership, Church Care & Fellowship & Bereavement Team, where they do meals for families when there is a death. She is also secretary for her Sunday School Class.

She joined Col. John Green Chapter of Daughters of American Revolution in 2000. Their meetings are a lot of time the same as BPW, but she goes to their Saturday meetings.

Lena is a cat lover and she has a big black cat named Simba from the Lion King & he is pretty sure he is the only cat in Hopkinsville!

May 17, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 P.M. by President Diane Croney-Turner who welcomed club members.

The Pledge was led by Martha Marcum and the Collect by Dorothy Tolliver.

Jean Tuitele moved, and Karen Lamb seconded the motion, that the April minutes as printed in the May HOPPER, be approved. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report was given by Lena Wann. Total assets as of April 30, 2018 were \$9,712.55. Membership is 30. Report will be filed for audit..

Correspondence –Executive Assistant Martha Marcum read thank-you notes from Salvation Army, Dyslexia Association of the Pennyrile, Sanctuary Inc., and St. Luke Free Clinic for the club's donations.

Unfinished Business:

- A. Get Stepping KFBPW – Steps need to be turned in to Diane tonight
- B. Volunteer Recording Sheet –Record keeping started over again in May
- C. Pecans – Paula Knight still has some and Peggy Stricklin still has a few
- D. Relay for Life – June 8 at Stadium of Champions – more information to follow in "Other".
- E. Report Submissions – President Diane stated that they had all been turned in on time.
- F. KFBPW – State Conference will be held June 22-23 in Bowling Green at the Hilton Gardens Inn.
- G. Other – Peggy Stricklin announced that our club had raised \$750 for the Heart Walk. She read a note from Suzanne Riley saying that 16% more money had been raised than last year.

Relay for Life – Peggy Stricklin and Lori Morris are in charge of this event. Since the theme of the event is "Heroes", Lori suggested that members dress as heroines of the Bible. Volunteers are needed to help her set up the campsite. Motion was made by Peggy Stricklin and seconded by Tamara Standard that the club give Lori \$100 to set up our campsite and fill a basket with kitchen goods and local products which will be raffled off at Relay. Theater tickets will be used. Martha Marcum has a basket and her son, Bob Lancaster, will put it together. President Diane will ask her pastor if we can meet at her church on Thursday, June 7, at 5:00 P.M., to firm up details.

New Business:

- A. Audit Committee – Peggy Stricklin moved, and Mary Fletcher seconded the motion, that an Audit Committee be formed which will bring back their report at the August meeting. Motion passed. Since Karen Lamb was nominated first, she will serve as chair of the committee. Karen Drennan and Karen Hunter will make up the rest of the committee.
- B. Other – Scholarship – Chair Ann Boseman presented the report of the Scholarship Committee. A meeting was held on Wednesday, May 9, to go over the scholarship applications. 24 applications were submitted, but only 12 were considered due to failure to complete the application as required. The three students who will be awarded scholarships are Kelsey Miller, Erin Hargrove, and Jordan Jones. Ann will send a letter notifying them that they are the winners, however, they cannot be told the amount until the 2018-2019 budget is passed. A recommendation was made by the Scholarship Committee that club member, Jamie Boyd, be given a donation to assist her as she pursues her education at Freed Hardeman University in Tennessee. The amount is to be included in the 2018-2019 budget and presented in August 2018. It was stressed that this is a donation and not a scholarship. Ann Boseman, Scholarship Chair, presented the recommendation. Since it came from a committee, a second was not necessary. Motion passed.

The program was presented by the Scholarship Committee. It was a fun evening, with club members learning to speak a little Spanish. Chair Ann Boseman, along with the help of club member Ana Sanchez, put together games using Spanish words. Ana also made a cake and passed out small pieces to club members. Ann thanked her committee members for their help with the program.

President Diane asked if we could go directly into our Board Meeting while we were eating, which we did at 6:42 P.M.

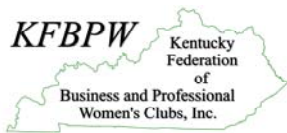
