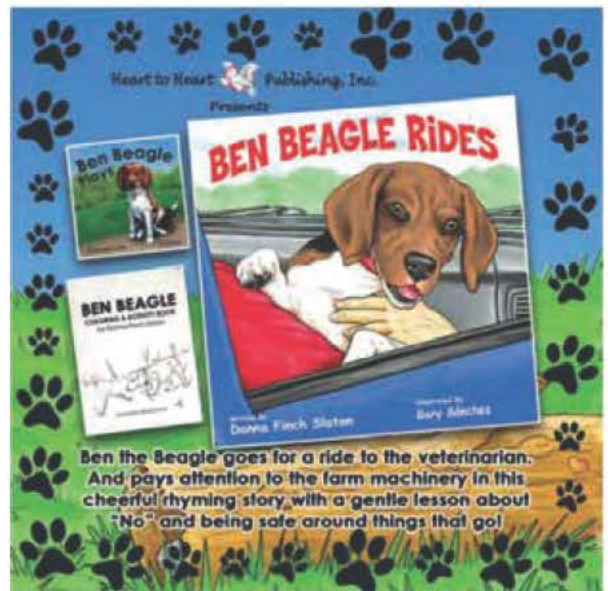
Russell County BPW

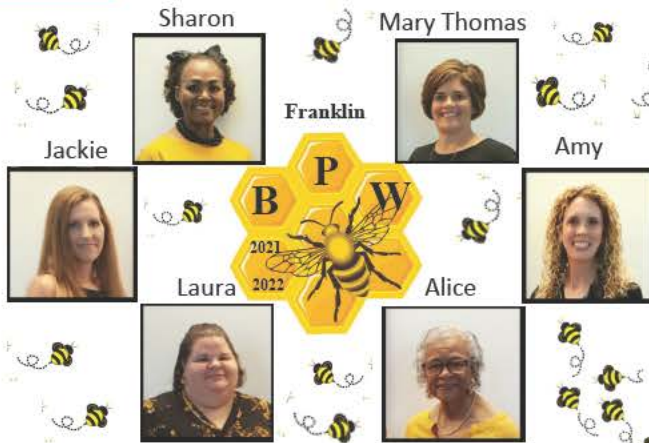
