It allows questions of interest to a group/organization to be deliberated on and to arrive at a decision based on the will of the group/organization. It provides the structure that allows for debate and reach group decisions-usually by vote-with the least possible resistance.

I am honored to serve as the chair of the board of trustees for 2015-2016. Serving on this board is one of the most rewarding positions one can have in the BPW organization. A big thank you goes to Donna Seeberger for her service last year as chair.

During state conference, we awarded \$6,895 in scholarships from the general fund, and \$4,800 from the artist fund, for a total of \$11,695. Total scholarships and grants for 2014-15 amounted to \$18,550. This is only possible because of the generosity of our members, clubs, regions, and the KFBPW.

Don't forget to include a line item for Foundation in your local's budget. Or better still, have a FUN raiser and donate the proceeds as some locals already do. If you wish it to go to the Promise Campaign for immediate use as scholarships, be sure to designate as such on the check. Otherwise, it goes in our investments in the general fund and we only use income from dividends and interest from it to award scholarships.

Also, don't forget to utilize the Betty Hinz fund for workshops you might plan for the year. This fund can only be used for communications workshops, but that is a broad subject and can include many things. Also on the website is our scholarship application. Members who have children, grandchildren, or other worthy candidates may find further information there. Deadline for scholarships is April 30 and October 31 of each year. Communication grants may be submitted for consideration as they are needed.
