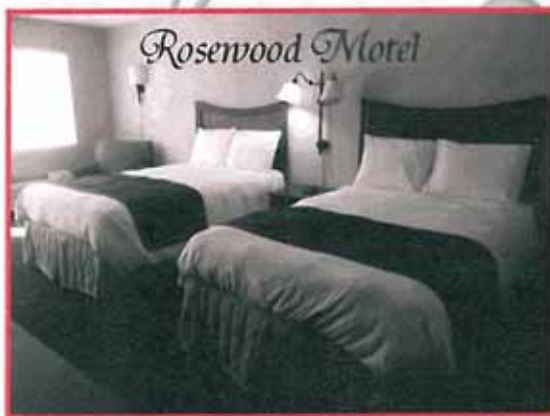
Welcome to Rosewood Golf Club and Cabins

Rosewood, Springfield BPW, Inc. and KFBPW are all excited to be hosting the 2016 Interim Board of Directors meeting in Lebanon this year. I hope you have clicked on the link from the KFBPW website to get a look at the awesome facilities. However, while the photos are fairly current the rates listed are two years old.

Because this arrangement is different from other venues we have visited, we wanted to clarify the process a little more in depth.

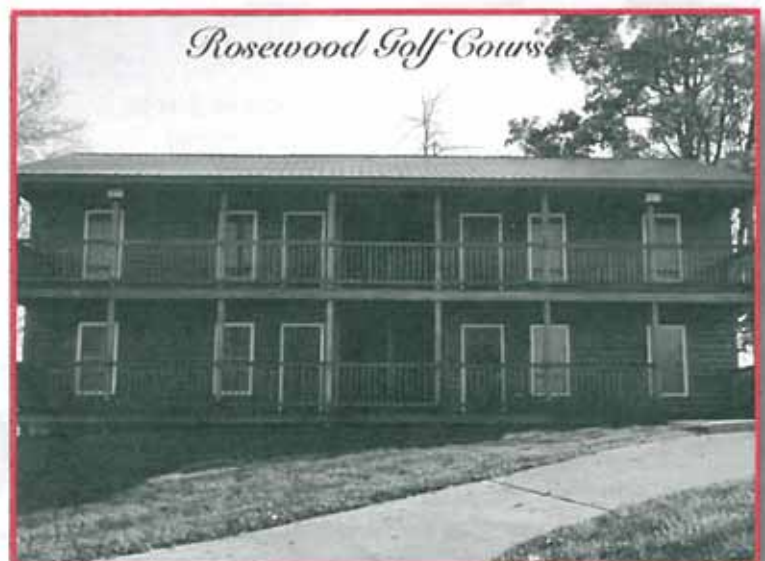
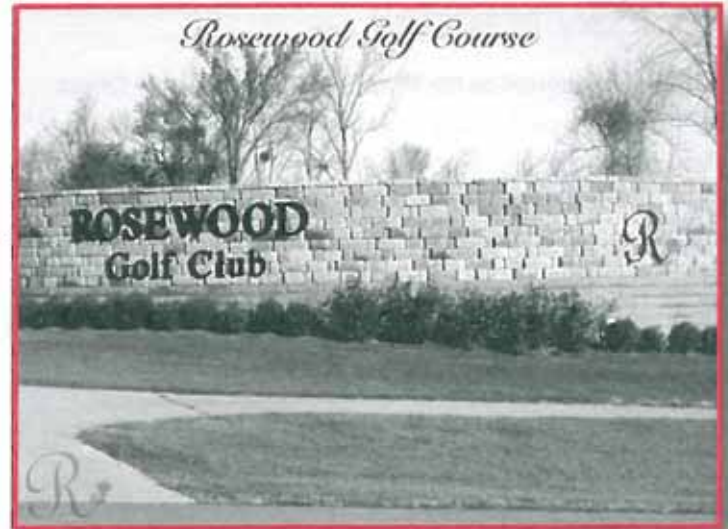
Hotel reservations must be made directly with the Co-Contact Chair Dianne Simms by October 25, 2016. Do not contact Rosewood Golf Club directly since they will not be able to offer you the lower negotiated rates.

There is a designated space on the registration form to make your hotel reservations. Check which nights you plan to stay and who you will be rooming with so we can be sure to make the correct accommodations. Hotel reservations should accompany your registration. We would appreciate it if you could send a separate check for your portion of the hotel reservation along with your check for your conference registration. Checks should be made out to KFBPW and mailed to: Dianne Simms, 410 W. Virginia Ave, Springfield, KY 40069. If you want to send one check for the entire room, that is okay too. Just be sure to include all the conference registrations forms for those staying in the room in the same envelope.



Rates for the conference are \$86 per night per room. This includes all taxes and fees. Hotel rooms are comparable to a Hampton Inn with two queen beds and other comparable amenities. There are also a limited number of cabins available on a first come first serve basis. Each has a living area and kitchenette with full size refrigerator, 2 bedrooms with 2 double beds in each room and 2 baths. You must have a minimum of 4 people in order to book a cabin. Cost for the cabin is \$172 per night which includes taxes and fees.

Interim Board Speaker **Sister Judy Morris**

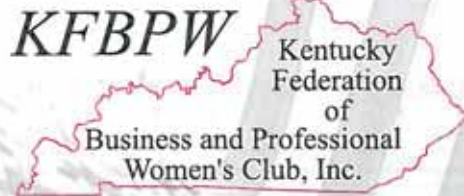


Sr. Judy is a Dominican Sister of Peace who just completed a seven year term as Justice Promoter for her congregation. In that role she coordinated the work of four justice committees: human trafficking, immigration reform, Eco justice and peace. She has spoken to civic groups, college and high schools students, and church groups on the world-wide crisis that is human trafficking. As a member of PATH (Persons Against Trafficking Humans) she has assisted in coordinating prayer services and events around Louisville focusing on human trafficking. Through her efforts the Dominican Sisters of Peace are represented on the board of U.S. Sisters Against Human Trafficking.

After receiving her Masters Degree in Social Work from Barry University in Miami, Florida, Sr. Judy worked for Catholic Charities of Chicago as a social service coordinator in parishes, bringing social services to neighborhoods. She has also served as Director of the Office of Social Concerns for the Diocese of Owensboro, Kentucky and Field Representative for Catholic Extension. During this time she has served on boards including the Kentucky Council of Churches, Dare to Care Food Bank, the Owensboro Human Relations Commission, and most recently, the 8th Center for Justice Assembly in Chicago and Faiths Untied to Prevent Gun Violence. In all of those roles she has never forgotten the challenging words of St. Catherine of Siena: "Speak as if you have a million voices. It is silence that kills the world."

Sr. Judy has published in numerous national newspapers and magazines. She will be speaking to us on Human Trafficking.
